
Daylight Savings time *ENDS* Sunday, November 7. Remember to set your clocks back one hour before retiring for the evening Saturday, November 6.

An anonymous story has it that: "An atheist was walking through the woods admiring al the 'accidents' that evolution had created. 'What majestic trees! What powerful rivers! What beautiful animals!' he said to himself.

As he was walking alongside the river, he heard a rustling in the bushes behind him. Turning to look, he saw a 7-foot grizzly bear charge towards him. He ran away as fast as he could up the path.

He looked over his shoulder and saw the grizzly was closing. Somehow he ran even faster, so scared that tears came to his eyes. He looked again, and the bear was even closer. His heart was pounding, and he tried to run faster. He tripped and fell to the ground. He rolled over to pick himself up, but the bear was right over him, reaching for him with its left paw and raising its right paw to strike him.

At that instant the atheist cried, 'Oh my God!'

Time stopped. The bear froze. The forest was silent. Even the river stopped moving.

Worship News

As we begin the month of November, your session at First Presbyterian Church, Glendale is working together, trying to discern the safest way forward for Sunday services as the colder weather arrives. Like you, we hope we will be able to be a part of Worship services that will allow more participation and that will also be more celebratory in nature. Please keep session in your prayers as we navigate these important decisions!

November 1 is All Saints Day, which has been celebrated on this date since the year 835. Just as the name suggests, it is a day that recognizes all canonized saints within the parameters of the Catholic church. Some Protestant churches, including PCUSA, continue to note this day in their liturgical year. Presbyterians specifically will often celebrate All Saints Day on the first Sunday in the month of November. The Presbyterian Church, USA describes it this way: "All Saints Day has a rather different focus in the Reformed tradition. While we may give thanks

for the lives of luminaries of the past, the emphasis is on the ongoing sanctification of the *whole* people of God. This is an appropriate time to give thanks to members of the community of faith who have died in the past year. And we also pray that we can be included in the company of the faithful in God's eternal realm."

As a rule, the last Sunday in the Reformed liturgical season is "The Feast of Christ the King." Revelations 1: 4-8 offers the following: "The Feast of Christ the King is observed to offer thanks and praise for the sovereignty of Christ, who is Lord of all creation and is coming again in glory to reign." Hymns such as "Crown Him with Many Crowns" and "Rejoice the Lord is King" are often associated with this final Sunday before Advent begins. The timing of this day of thanks and praise aligns in a beautiful way with Thanksgiving, which this year is celebrated only four days later, on November 25.
